



Junior School Behaviour Policy 2014

The MCC Junior School Behaviour policy takes into account teachers' duty of care in protecting students from injury or harm (physical and emotional) and aims to teach students to develop the Holy Family Virtues of Peace and Hope, Learning, Faith and Love by teaching students to treat others with respect, kindness and dignity at all times.

The behaviour policy involves a number of positive incentives to behave appropriately and a number of negative consequences for bad behaviour.

MCC JUNIOR SCHOOL RULES

1. Show kindness and respect to ourselves (eg, wear uniform with pride, play within designated areas to remain safe, no swearing, complete homework).
2. Show kindness and respect to others (eg, no rough play, no running on the paved areas).
3. Show kindness and respect to our College community (eg, treat all property with respect, do not distract our classmates from learning).
4. Show kindness and respect to our environment (eg, do not litter).

POSITIVE INCENTIVES

Students receive the following incentives for following school rules:

- High Five cards.
- Merit Awards.
- Achievement Awards.
- Bronzies.
- Aussie of the Month Awards.
- Letter of Commendation at end of term for No Behaviour Slips, these students will also receive extra playtime on the last day of each term (**starting Term 3, 2014**).

NEGATIVE CONSEQUENCES

If students choose to break school rules the following consequences will occur:

1. Verbal warning.
2. Time out (in classroom or on playground).
3. Behaviour Slip (see attached).
4. 3 x Behaviour Slips: Lunchtime Detention.
5. 6 x Behaviour Slips: Parent Meeting/Behaviour Contract (See attached).
