The following outlines the fees and charges for the 2019 school year. Fees are set incorporating the costs of all items known to be an integral part of the curriculum, including tuition, compulsory levies, year level fees and some camps and excursions.

Amenities Fee

This fee contributes to miscellaneous student related expenses. The balance of this expenditure is subsidised by the College. The following levies and charges detail the major areas where the College utilises the collected Amenities Fee:

- Catholic Church Insurance – Basic cover for every student. Details – www.ccinsurance.org.au. MCC Policy No: 06 PAE 0101534. This policy covers students for accidents both in school and out while they are enrolled at the College.
- Catholic Education WA Student per Capita Levies: Copyright, Co-Responsibility, K-12 Miscellaneous Educational Levy, New Site Acquisition Fund Levy.
- Mandurah Catholic College – College Annual, Library resources, sport equipment, House Days, Liturgies, Masses and Speech & Awards Ceremony; classroom general supplies (including tissues and sunscreen; cleaning costs associated with classrooms and toilet facilities; maintenance of buildings, furniture and grounds).

ICT Service Fee

Primary School – Pre-Primary to Year 6 **\$63**

Secondary School – Year 7 to Year 12 **\$121**

This fee contributes to the costs of maintaining the technical support for all iPads and laptops associated with Information Technology.

- SEQTA/CONEQT – a student data recording and reporting tool accessible by teachers and parents.

Compulsory Activities, Camps, Incursions, Excursions and Retreats

Correspondence including a student permission slip will be sent home detailing the activity. All compulsory costs for camps, incursions and excursions are included in your account. **Please note** there will be no refund/credits if your child does not attend any planned compulsory activity as these costs are pre-paid up to a year in advance.

Family Levies

'Parents & Friends' Levy: **\$50** per family per annum

This applies to all Primary and Secondary School families. This levy goes towards purchasing resources and equipment necessary to providing students with quality education.

Building Levy: **\$607** per family per annum

This is a compulsory payment and is **not tax deductible**. This levy applies to all Primary and Secondary School families and contributes towards maintaining the College and Capital Development.

Family Discount (applied to tuition fees only)

Primary School 2nd Child – 10% 3rd Child – 20% 4th Child or more – 100%

Secondary School 2nd Child – 15% 3rd Child – 50% 4th Child or more – 100%

Family discount also applies to students who are in another Catholic Primary School in the Peel Region.

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Payment Options & Methods

All accounts are to be finalised by **8 November, 2019**

Payment Arrangements for the year must be set up with the College Finance Officer no later than 31 March, 2019.

The College offers the following payment options:

Option 1	Annual Payment.	Full year's fees paid in full by 31 March, 2019 (eligible for Tuition Fee Lottery).
Option 2	10 monthly, 20 fortnightly or 40 weekly instalments.	Fees paid in equal instalments from February – November 2019.
Option 3	Variations of these options, such as continuous fortnightly payments, etc.	Requires discussion with the Finance Officer.

Families that pay their account in full by **31 March, 2019** will be eligible to win a tuition fee credit for their eldest student in 2020, or a refund of their tuition fee if it is their students' last year in 2019. The winning family will be announced in the College Newsfeed.

The College accepts the following payment methods:

Credit Card	Credit cards can be taken over the phone, in person or a regular payment plan can be set up to be debited.
Direct Debit	A regular payment plan can be set up to be debited from your designated bank account.
Cheque	In person or via mail – please provide your details with payment.
BPAY	Using the Biller Code 100115 and the reference number on your statement.

Health Care Card Tuition Fee Concession

This is available to parents/guardians who hold a current Health Care Card or Pensioner/Veteran's Concession Card which bears the code "PPS". Applications for concession for Tuition Fees are only available from the College Finance Officer.

Secondary Assistance Scheme Concession

This is offered by the Department of Education to parents/guardians holding a current Health Care Card or Pensioner/Veteran's Concession Card and includes a Clothing Allowance of \$115 (paid directly to the parent/guardian's bank account). Application for this concession has a Government cut-off date of **12 April, 2019**.

Notice of Withdrawal

Parents are required to give one term's notice in writing if they choose to withdraw their child from the College during the course of the school year. If a student is withdrawn without notice during a term, the equivalent of fees for that term will be charged.

Late Payment

In ensuring fairness to families who pay fees in accordance with the College's Fee Policy, the College rigorously follows up overdue accounts. Debt Collection Agencies or Solicitors may also be engaged, and any costs incurred by the College in recovering fees will be charged to the account.

Financial Difficulties

The College accepts that from time to time families may find themselves in difficult circumstances. Parents/guardians experiencing genuine financial hardship should contact the College to discuss alternative options for payment of tuition fees.
