EDUCATION PERFECT FEES

A complete booklist with fees for subject-specific books and materials (including electronic subscriptions) can be found on the 2020 Year Group Booklist. Electronic Book Fees (Education Perfect) is a **mandatory** purchase for students to complete homework and assessments.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

The College accepts Credit Card, Direct Debit, Cheque and BPAY. All payments are to be finalised by November, 2020. **Arrangements for the year must be set up with the College Finance Officer no later than 31 March 2020.**

The College offers the following payment options:

OPTION 1	Annual Payment	Full year's fees paid in full by 31 March, 2020
OPTION 2	26 equal fortnightly payments, annually	Fees paid in equal instalments (see Finance Officer for details)
OPTION 3	10 monthly, 20 fortnightly or 40 weekly	Fees paid in equal instalments from February - November
OPTION 4	Variations of these options, such as tax refund, bonuses, etc	Requires discussion with the Finance officer

**All College fees are reviewed annually. The College encourages paying fees upfront OR continuous fortnightly deductions as the preferred option for payment.*

TUITION FEE LOTTERY

Families that pay their account in full by 31 March, 2020 will go into the tuition fee lottery and be eligible to win a tuition fee credit for their eldest student in 2021, or a refund of their tuition fee if it is their students' last year in 2020. Winners will be announced in the College News Feed.

AMENITIES FEE

This fee contributes to miscellaneous student related expenses. The balance of this expenditure is subsidised by the College. The following levies and charges detail the major areas where the College utilises the collected Amenities Fee:

- Catholic Church Insurance – Basic cover for every student. Details – www.ccinsurance.org.au. MCC Policy No: 06 PAE 0101534. This policy covers students 24/7 for accidents both in school and out while they are enrolled at the College.
- Catholic Education WA Student per Capita Levies: Copyright, Co-Responsibility, K-12 Miscellaneous Educational Levy, New Site Acquisition Fund Levy.
- Mandurah Catholic College – College Annual, Library resources, sport equipment, House Days, Liturgies, Masses and Speech & Awards Ceremony; classroom general supplies (including tissues and sunscreen; cleaning costs associated with classrooms and toilet facilities; maintenance of buildings, furniture and grounds).

ICT SERVICE FEE

This fee contributes to the costs of maintaining the technical support for all iPads and laptops including:

- Catholic Education WA Student/Capita Levy: ICT Levies.
- SEQTA/CONEQT – a student data recording and reporting tool accessible by teachers and parents.

COMPULSORY ACTIVITIES, CAMPS, INCURSIONS, EXCURSIONS AND RETREATS

Correspondence including a student permission slip will be sent home detailing the activity. All compulsory costs for camps, incursions and excursions are included in your account. Please note there will be no refund/credits if your child does not attend any planned compulsory activity as these costs are pre-paid up to a year in advance.

TOURS

Tours are considered optional and are self-funded by attendees. They include Canberra Tour, Europe Tour, STEM USA Tour. Students will **not** be eligible to participate if school fees account is in arrears or no payment plan is in place.

FAMILY LEVIES

'Parents & Friends' Levy applies to all Primary and Secondary School families. This levy goes towards purchasing resources and equipment necessary to providing students with quality education.

Building Levy is a compulsory payment and is **not tax deductible**. This levy applies to all Primary and Secondary School families and contributes towards maintaining the College and Capital Development.

HEALTH CARE CARD TUITION FEE CONCESSION

This is available to parents/guardians who hold a current Health Care Card or Pensioner/Veteran's Concession Card which bears the code "PPS", child(ren) name must be listed on the card. Applications for concession for Tuition Fees are only available from the College Finance Officer. The concession card must be provided by 9 April, 2020 to be eligible for full discount. Concessions can only be applied during the validity period of the Health Care Card, ie discounts will cease with Health Care Card expiry date.

SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME CONCESSION

This is offered by the Department of Education to parents/guardians holding a current Health Care Card or Pensioner/Veteran's Concession Card and includes a Clothing Allowance of \$115 (paid directly to the parent/guardian's bank account). Application for this concession has a Government cut-off date by 9 April, 2020.

NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL

Parents are required to give one term's notice in writing if they choose to withdraw their child from the College during the course of the school year. If a student is withdrawn without notice during a term, the equivalent of fees for that term will be charged.

LATE PAYMENT

In ensuring fairness to families who pay fees in accordance with the College's Fee Policy, the College rigorously follows up overdue accounts. Debt Collection Agencies or Solicitors may also be engaged, and any costs incurred by the College in recovering fees will be charged to the account.

FINANCIAL DIFFICULTIES

The College accepts that from time to time families may find themselves in difficult circumstances. Parents/guardians experiencing genuine financial hardship should contact the College to discuss alternative options for payment of tuition fees.
